COMPLAINT FOR RECLAMATION OF GOODS PURSUANT TO 11 U.S.C. § 546(c) AND RELATED RELIEF

Simon & Schuster, Inc. ("Plaintiff"), a seller of goods to Advanced Marketing Services, Inc. ("Defendant"), brings this Complaint for Reclamation of Goods Pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 546(c) and Related Relief (the "Complaint") against Defendant, and alleges as follows:

JURISDICTIONAL ALLEGATIONS

- 1. This adversary proceeding arises out of and is related to the above-captioned chapter 11 cases pending before the United States Bankruptcy Court for the District of Delaware (this "Court"). Therefore, this Court has jurisdiction pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 157 and 1334.
 - 2. This adversary proceeding is a core proceeding pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 157(b)(2).
 - 3. Venue is proper in this Court pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1409(a).

GENERAL ALLEGATIONS

- 4. Plaintiff, a New York corporation with its principal place of business at 1230 Avenue of the Americas, New York, New York, is a global leader in the field of general interest publishing that provides a range of quality books and multimedia products across a wide variety of genres and formats.
- 5. Defendant, a Delaware corporation, is a wholesaler and distributor of books and other media.
- 6. On December 29, 2006 (the "Petition Date"), Defendant filed a petition for relief under chapter 11 of title 11 of the United States Code (the "Bankruptcy Code").
- 7. Within 45 days immediately before the Petition Date, Defendant received certain goods (the "Goods") that Plaintiff sold to Defendant. A summary of the Plaintiff's invoices for the Goods, which have an aggregate value of \$5,105,629.65, is attached as **Exhibit A** hereto.
 - 8. Each of the Goods are clearly identified on the invoices attached as **Exhibit B**.
- 9. On December 29, 2006, Plaintiff sent a written demand for reclamation of goods to Defendant demanding the immediate return of the Goods to Plaintiff (the "Demand"). A copy of the Demand is attached as **Exhibit C**.

FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION (Reclamation of Goods – 11 U.S.C. § 546(c))

- 10. Plaintiff repeats, realleges and incorporates by reference herein the allegations contained in paragraphs 1 through 9 of the Complaint as though fully set forth in this first cause of action.
 - 11. Defendant was insolvent at the time it received the Goods.
- 12. The Goods were sold to the Defendant in the ordinary course of Plaintiff's business.

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- 13. By the Demand, Plaintiff demanded reclamation of the Goods from Defendant in writing:
 - a. Not later than 45 days after the date of receipt of the Goods by the Defendant; or
 - b. Not later than 20 days after the Petition Date, if the 45 day period expired after the Petition Date.
- 14. Based upon the foregoing, the Plaintiff is entitled to immediate reclamation of the Goods pursuant to section 546(c) of the Bankruptcy Code.

SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION (Allowance and Payment - 11 U.S.C. § 503(b)(1))

- 15. Plaintiff repeats, realleges and incorporates by reference herein the allegations contained in paragraphs 1 through 14 of the Complaint as though fully set forth in this second cause of action.
 - 16. Plaintiff has not received payment for any of the Goods.
 - 17. Plaintiff is entitled to reclamation of the Goods.
- 18. To the extent that any of the Goods left the possession of Defendant after the commencement of Defendant's chapter 11 case (the "Distributed Goods"), Plaintiff is entitled to immediate payment for the Distributed Goods.
- 19. Based upon the foregoing, Plaintiff is entitled to allowance and immediate payment of an administrative claim pursuant section 503(b)(1) of the Bankruptcy Code equal to the value of the Distributed Goods.

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THIRD CAUSE OF ACTION (Allowance and Payment of Administrative Claim - 11 U.S.C. § 503(b)(9))

- 20. Plaintiff repeats, realleges and incorporates by reference herein the allegations contained in paragraphs 1 through 19 of the Complaint as though fully set forth in this third cause of action.
- 21. The Goods received by Defendant within the 20 days before the Petition Date (the "503(b)(9) Goods"), which have an aggregate value of \$2,146,126.50, are summarized on **Exhibit D** hereto, and are identified on the corresponding invoices attached as Exhibit B hereto.
- 22. The 503(b)(9) Goods were sold by the Plaintiff to the Defendant in the ordinary course of Plaintiff's business.
 - 23. Plaintiff has not received payment for any of the 503(b)(9) Goods.
- 24. Based upon the foregoing, Plaintiff is entitled to allowance and immediate payment of an administrative claim pursuant to section 503(b)(9) of the Bankruptcy Code in the aggregate amount of \$2,146,126.50.

FOURTH CAUSE OF ACTION (Accounting)

- 25. Plaintiff repeats, realleges and incorporates by reference herein the allegations contained in paragraphs 1 through 24 of the Complaint as though fully set forth in this fourth cause of action.
- 26. On information and belief, the Defendant remains in possession of a portion of the Goods (the "Unsold Goods").
- 27. Plaintiff is entitled to reclamation of the Unsold Goods and allowance and immediate payment of an administrative claim for the value of the Distributed Goods.

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- 28. Plaintiff has not received payment for any of the Goods and, despite requesting an accounting of the Goods, has not received such accounting from Defendant.
- 29. Based on the foregoing, an accounting is necessary to determine the extent of Plaintiff's administrative claim for the Distributed Goods and the extent of the Unsold Goods that are subject to reclamation.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff requests that the Bankruptcy Court:

- a. Allow the Plaintiff to reclaim the Goods pursuant to section 546(c) of the Bankruptcy Code;
- b. Allow and compel immediate payment to the Plaintiff of an administrative claim for the value of the Distributed Goods pursuant to section 503(b)(1) of the Bankruptcy Code;
- c. Allow and compel immediate payment to the Plaintiff of an administrative claim for the amount of the 503(b)(9) Goods pursuant to section 503(b)(9) of the Bankruptcy Code to the extent not reclaimed;
- d. Compel Defendant to provide the Plaintiff with a comprehensive written accounting of the status and disposition of all of the Goods;
- e. Award Plaintiff its attorneys' fees, costs and other expenses incurred in this action to the extent permitted by law and contract; and

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f. Grant the Plaintiff such other and further relief as the Court deems just and appropriate.



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

NOTICE OF DISPUTE RESOLUTION ALTERNATIVES

As party to litigation you have a right to adjudication of your matter by a judge of this Court. Settlement of your case, however, can often produce a resolution more quickly than appearing before a judge. Additionally, settlement can also reduce the expense, inconvenience, and uncertainty of litigation.

There are dispute resolution structures, other than litigation, that can lead to resolving your case. Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) is offered through a program established by this Court. The use of these services are often productive and effective in settling disputes. The purpose of this Notice is to furnish general information about ADR.

The ADR structures used most often are mediation, early-neutral evaluation, mediation/arbitration and arbitration. In each, the process is presided over by an impartial third party, called the "neutral".

In mediation and early neutral evaluation, an experienced neutral has no power to impose a settlement on you. It fosters an environment where offers can be discussed and exchanged. In the process, together, you and your attorney will be involved in weighing settlement proposals and crafting a settlement. The Court in its Local Rules requires all ADR processes, except threat of a potential criminal action, to be confidential. You will not be prejudiced in the event a settlement is not achieved because the presiding judge will not be advised of the content of any of your settlement discussions.

Mediation/arbitration is a process where you submit to mediation and, if it is unsuccessful, agree that the mediator will act as an arbitrator. At that point, the process is the same as arbitration. You, through your counsel, will present evidence to a neutral, who issues a decision. If the matter in controversy arises in the main bankruptcy case or arises from a subsidiary issue in an adversary proceeding, the arbitration, though voluntary, may e binding. If a party requests *de novo* review of an arbitration award, the judge will rehear the case.

Your attorney can provide you with additional information about ADR and advise you as to whether and when ADR might be helpful in your case.
